GENERAL RULES FOR ALL EXHIBITS

1. All classes are open to Boone County Extension Homemakers Club members or any resident of Boone County 18 years of age or older in Adult Classes and age 17 & under in the Junior class. (See rules for children in Fine Arts and Photography).
2. Tags for entries may be picked up from the Extension Office prior to the fair.
3. Pre-entry required for Creative Writing. (See Arts, Crafts and Hobbies.)
4. CHECK IN. Entries will ONLY be received between 9:00 – 10:00 p.m. on Sunday night, July 20 and 8:00 to 11:00 a.m. on Monday morning, July 21.
5. No entry fee will be charged.
6. CHECK OUT. Entries are to be checked out on Thursday night, July 24 at 8:00 p.m until 9:00 p.m. All articles must be removed and ribbons and premiums picked up at check out time or forfeited. If you cannot personally be there to pick up your exhibits, make arrangements with someone to get your exhibits for you. The Extension Homemakers Exhibit Committee will not be responsible for articles left after check out. Anything left after August 1 will be disposed of and the open show committee will not be responsible for any loss thereof.
7. Classes for individuals will be provided in six departments – Arts, Crafts & Hobbies; Culinary; Fine Arts; Flower & Garden; Needlecraft; and Photography.
8. Any article left unattended before being officially entered will not be accepted for exhibit.
9. The chairman of the department reserves the right to determine in what class an article belongs.
10. If there is no classification for an article, it may not be entered except in the "Do Your Own Thing" class.
11. If there is a class for an item, it may not be entered under miscellaneous or in another department.
12. Precautions will be taken to insure the safety of the articles entered, but in no case will the management be responsible for the loss or damage of any article.
13. Articles should come ready to display. Colorless plastic food wrap or zip-up plastic bags may be used to cover articles.
14. Any article that received a ribbon in previous years may not be entered again.
15. Blue, red and white ribbons will be given as merited, meaning there can be any number of ribbons in a given class. Sweepstakes, Champions, and Reserve Champions will be chosen as merited from the blue ribbon winners and the blue ribbon will be removed from these three exhibits.
 - (A). * Denotes division where sweepstakes may be given.
 - (B). Each exhibit will receive only one ribbon and one cash award with the exception of Rule C as follows.
 - (C). All special, memorial, committee, and people's choice awards are in addition to the ribbons and cash awards.
16. If no competition exists and article is not worthy of first premium, it may be awarded second or third place or none. Awards will be given at judge's discretion. All awards may not be given.
17. Originality may be considered in final places in all departments.
18. Functioning guns, knives and other weapons will not be accepted.
19. All articles must be handmade by exhibitor except quilts 25 years old and over and antiques entered in "Do Your Own Thing", and crafts made with assistance.
20. Collections and posters are not appropriate exhibits.
21. "Amateur" and "professional" will be classed separately. Professional classes will be designed with a "P" preceding class number. Professional exhibitors must derive \$1,000 of his/her annual income from sales of and/or teaching their crafts.
22. Professional class winners will be given ribbons indicating their placing. No money will be awarded.
23. Any exhibitor removing an exhibit before specified release time will not be permitted to exhibit the following year. Ribbons and prize money will not be given to anyone removing an exhibit before release time.
24. There may be some changes made in the listed special and memorial awards. Any additions will be posted in the display area during the Open Show.

Creative Cookery Contest Using Peach 2008

(Sponsored By Boone County Extension Homemakers)

(Note: 2009 Contest will be PINEAPPLE)

Wednesday, July 23, 2008

12:00 - 1:00 p.m. – Check in at the Dining Room of Community Building

1:00 p.m. – Open Judging

1. This contest is open to Boone County residents and Boone County Extension Homemaker Club members.
2. The product may be made from scratch or a box mix may be part of the ingredients.
3. All entries may be accompanied by the recipe which must be printed or typed on one side of a paper WITHOUT your name. All recipes will become the property of BCEH.
4. Each entry should be wrapped in colorless plastic food wrap or zip-up plastic bag which will allow easy access for judge's inspection.
5. Each entry **must** contain Peach in the baked part of the article.
6. Persons may enter only one entry per class.
7. There will be 7 classes of entry:
 - Bread (1 loaf either quick or yeast)
 - Cake
 - Candy
 - Cookies (6)
 - Dessert
 - Muffins (6)
 - Pie (Must follow Food Safety Guidelines in rule #8)
8. **ALL EXHIBITS MUST MEET THE FOLLOWING PURDUE UNIVERSITY FOOD SAFETY GUIDE LINES.** *For baked product competition: Filling, frosting, glazing, pie filling and meringue whether uncooked or cooked are not permitted to contain cream cheese, whipped cream, unpasteurized milk or eggs/egg whites (pasteurized eggs or eggs cooked to 160°F may be used). Home-canned fruits, vegetables, or meats are not permitted in products. Recipes **must be provided** that show which ingredients were used in each part of the product. Contestants should carefully wash their hands and make sure that their hands do not have any open cuts before preparing foods. Contestants should not prepare ready-to-eat foods to be entered into competition if they are ill with vomiting, diarrhea, fever, sore throat or jaundice. Whenever possible, baked products should be transported and stored in chilled coolers (41°F).*
9. Blue, red, or white placing ribbons will be awarded according to quality of the entry. A Champion will be selected from each class with a Sweepstakes selected from the Champions.
10. Portions of the champion entries will be kept for display.
11. Prize money will be awarded as follows:
 - \$10 to the Champion in each class
 - \$40 to the Sweepstakes
12. Entries may be sampled following judging.

CRITERIA FOR JUDGING

1. The total appearance of the product will be taken into consideration, including uniform color, even shape, and pleasant eye appeal.
2. Peach must be present in the baked part of the product, giving it a well blended characteristic flavor.
3. The product should contain internal quality including moist, tender crumb, and a fine texture.
4. Product should contain a pleasing peach flavor.

2. All articles must be handmade by the exhibitor within the past 3 years
3. All flowers used in this department must be dried or artificial.
4. Specify whether item is kit or original design.
5. All items intended for hanging during normal use must be ready to hang with dust cover on back with flat hangers that are sufficiently substantial to hold weight of object. (Back of pictures and hoops should have a dust cover.) (Entries will be dropped one placing if they do not meet specified rules.)
6. Collections such as rocks, shells, baseball cards are not acceptable exhibits.
7. Functioning guns, knives and other weapons will not be accepted.
8. "Do Your Own Thing" exhibits may have some parts not handmade by exhibitor.

4. All Articles are to be clean and in good condition.
5. Quilts will be judged on workmanship, quality of material, harmony of color & condition.
6. Other needlecraft garments and articles will be judged on general appearance, workmanship, color combination, smartness and originality of design, suitability of article for the purpose and following the requirements.
7. All pictures must be ready to hang (with dustcover on back) with flat hangers that are sufficiently substantial to hold weight of object. (Dustcover on back of hoops also) Item will be accepted but will be dropped a placing if it does not meet stated rules.
8. Each exhibitor should determine class for entry.
9. Exhibitor's items must be different style or pattern, not just different fabric or multiples of a set.

NURSING HOME / ASSISTED LIVING DIVISION -ADULT*

700. Any item or set. Limit of 5 entries per exhibitor.

CANVAS DIVISION - ADULT*

701. Any canvas item, which includes: Swedish -darning, needlepoint, plastic, rug punch, hooking, needle-punch, etc. Limit of 5 items per exhibitor.
