ENTRY INFORMATION

1. All contestants who plan to enter the 2008 Boone County 4-H Fair Queen Pageant must complete an entry form, which is due at the Boone County Extension Office no later than 4:00 pm, May 31, 2008.
2. A contestant must be a current or past member of Boone County 4-H and completed the majority of their activities in Boone County.
3. \$35.00 entry fee, payable to Boone County 4-H Club, Inc, should accompany the entry and may be paid by the sponsor. (Organization, business or individual)
4. Contestants will be expected to attend all preliminary meetings and activities in preparation for the pageant. They will be held June 8, 17 & 24 and July 7, & 12.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR CONTESTANTS

1. Each contestant must be at least 16 years of age and can not have had their 21st birthday as of August 15th, the first day of the 2008 Miss Indiana State Fair Queen Pageant.
2. A contestant must be a current or past member of Boone County 4-H and completed the majority of their activities in Boone County.
3. (a) Each contestant must be an active member of at least one worthwhile organization in their community: i.e. church groups, girl scouts, 4-H club, etc.
(b) In Boone County each contestant must have completed at least one (1) year of Boone County 4-H and at least four (4) 4-H projects in Boone County prior to the current year.
4. No professional model is eligible for the Boone County and State Fair Pageants. (A professional model is one who earns their livelihood by modeling. A contestant who works for a high school or college fashion board is not considered a professional model.)
5. Any contestant who has competed at the Miss Indiana State Fair Queen pageant cannot compete again.
6. The individual selected to serve as the Boone County 4-H Fair Queen will represent Boone County in the Miss Indiana State Fair Queen Pageant. Should this individual become ineligible for the Miss Indiana State Fair Queen Pageant, the runner-up may represent Boone County.

JUDGING INFORMATION

1. The Boone County 4-H Fair Queen will be selected on the basis of poise, personality and the ability to converse.
2. Judging will be divided into three divisions as follows:
 - (a) Personal Interview
Ability to converse
Poise
Personality
 - (b) Professional Wear (Suit or dress)
 - (c) Formal wear (Formal Gown or Tuxedo)

FOR THE WINNERS

1. The queen will serve as the official host for activities during the week of the Boone County fair. The queen's schedule of appearances will be under the direction of the fair board and the queen pageant committee.
2. The winning contestants will receive all the prizes at the pageant with the exception of the savings bonds, which will be presented at the 2009 pageant. (The queen will receive a \$200 savings bond, first and second runners-up each receive a \$100 savings bond.)
3. Should the 2008 Boone County 4-H Fair Queen become ineligible before the 2009 queen is crowned, they will forfeit their title, the crown, trophy and the rights to the \$200 savings bond to the first runner-up. Should the first runner-up become ineligible they will forfeit the title, crown, trophy and the rights to the savings bond to the second runner-up.

STATE FAIR PAGEANT

1. The winner (or first runner-up if the winner becomes ineligible) will represent Boone County at the Miss Indiana State Fair Queen Pageant, August 15 through August 17, and must abide by the State Fair rules.
2. Each county winner must be accompanied to the State Fair by their parent of the same sex or adult of the same sex (25 years of age or older) approved by the county fair board, queen pageant committee, and then the State Fair Queen Pageant Director.
3. If Boone County's representative is selected as the Miss Indiana State Fair Queen, they must agree to accept no other titles for a period of twelve months following the 2008 State Fair, except with prior approval of the Indiana State Fair Board.
