Get Fired Up for Reading!

Young readers are encouraged to “Get Fired Up for Reading” during the month of September! The youth department desk is now home to a small dragon, and children are encouraged to help the dragon reach great lengths! For each picture book read, or for each chapter of a chapter book read, children will be able to write their names on a dragon scale and add the scale to the dragon’s body! Let’s see how large our dragon can grow!

Young adults and adult readers are invited to a friendly competition with the youth department. A tree full of fall colors is in the adult department, and readers will help it shed its leaves by reading. For each chapter of a book read, readers may take a leaf from the top of the tree and create a pile at the bottom of the tree.

Who can read more chapters during the month of September? Which will grow faster--the dragon or the leaf-pile?

***Lonesome Dove* Book Discussion**

Join the Adult Book Discussion group as they read *Lonesome Dove*, Larry McMurtry’s 1986 Pulitzer Prize-winning epic novel of the West. “At first the novel seems the kind of anti-mythic, anti-heroic story one might expect: the main protagonists are a drunken and inarticulate pair of former Texas Rangers turned horse rustlers. Yet when the trail begins, the story picks up an energy and a drive that makes heroes of these men” (*from Amazon reviews*). Read the book that inspired the television miniseries enjoyed by millions.

Book discussion is scheduled for Monday, September 12 at 1:30 pm, and the group will meet in the Young Adult Reading Room. Discussions usually last approximately one hour, and light refreshments are provided. Those who have not finished the book are welcome to join and participate in discussion.

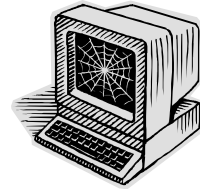

Mike Spear has built a beautiful case so that the hawk can be enjoyed close-up, and the bird has now been re-homed so that all can appreciate its beauty.
